# LIMING MADE EASY!

## What is GRAN - LIME?

- GRAN - LIME is a lime which is far more finely ground than typical ground limestone
- This finely ground lime is then formed into a granular lime (GRAN - LIME)

### NEW WAY - Granular



### OLD WAY - Dusty!!!



## APPLICATION RATES (Depending on soil type)

### Good pH:

Apply 185kgs/ha/year  
(1.5 x 50kg bags/acre/year)  
to maintain pH levels.

### Low pH:

Apply 370kgs/ha/year  
(3 x 50kg bags/acre/year)  
until pH rises and  
185kgs/ha/acre  
(1.5 x 50kg bags/acre/year)  
to maintain this pH level.

### Reseeding:

Apply 370kgs/ha/year  
(3 x 50kg bags/acre/year)  
at reseeding and 185kgs/ha  
(1.5 x 50 kg bags/acre) in  
subsequent years.

## WHY USE GRAN - LIME?

- GRAN - LIME is very fast acting
  - It has a total neutralising value (TNV) of 99%
1. Can be spread with conventional fertiliser spreader
  2. Farmer applied, no need for contractors
  3. Minimises the risk of compaction
  4. Can be used in conjunction with Urea based fertilisers (Note: Gran-Lime and Urea should be spread seperately)
  5. Granular lime - therefore not blown away by wind

GRAN - LIME is best applied at the beginning of the growing season, but can be used effectively at any time of the year.
